A full-proof mechanism for curriculum delivery and documentation had been made. First, a general Orientation Programme was organised to clarify the CBCS curricula to the newly admitted students. Second, each academic department is instructed to keep an internal feedback system from students, so that the teachers concerned could assess if the curricula delivery was comprehnsivble to the class. First, a well-organised departmental academic calender was made, and teachers were istructed to follow that. Second, in a block of two months, class tests were held to evaluate the students' progression, and feebback was collected to see if this mechanism was successful. And, fortunately, the mechanism proved to be successful.
